


- Animal** – A living thing that can move about and gets food from plants or other animals.
- Habitat** – The natural home for an animal or plant.





Key Vocabulary

Sea creature 	An animal that lives in the sea.
Gills 	The organ used for breathing by fish and other animals that live in water.
Fin 	Any of the thin parts that stick out from the body of a water animal that helps it move.
Rock pool 	A pool of water among rocks, often found at the beach.
Coral reef 	An area formed by thousands of tiny animals called coral polyps.


