Prior Learning

- Begin to sing call and response songs with limited melody
- Know a wide range of nursery rhymes

call and response Copy a melody or rhythm

pitch How high or low a note is

tempo The speed the music is played or sung

louder Getting a bigger volume

quieter Getting a quieter volume

Key Facts

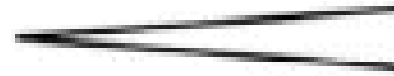
You can use your voice to make singing noises.

The melody made can be sung quicker, slower, louder, quieter, higher or lower. Sometimes a pause, called a rest, can be taken.

It is important to try and sing in tune, so you sing the same as those around you.

Your singing can be informed by shapes written down, or by hand gestures of your teacher (conductor)
