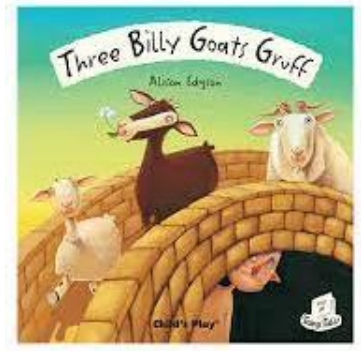
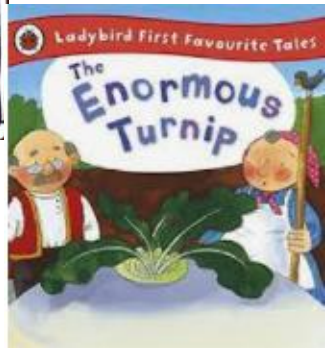
Traditional Tale		A story that has been retold over many years.
