 Uses some words that they have recently been introduced to in their writing.

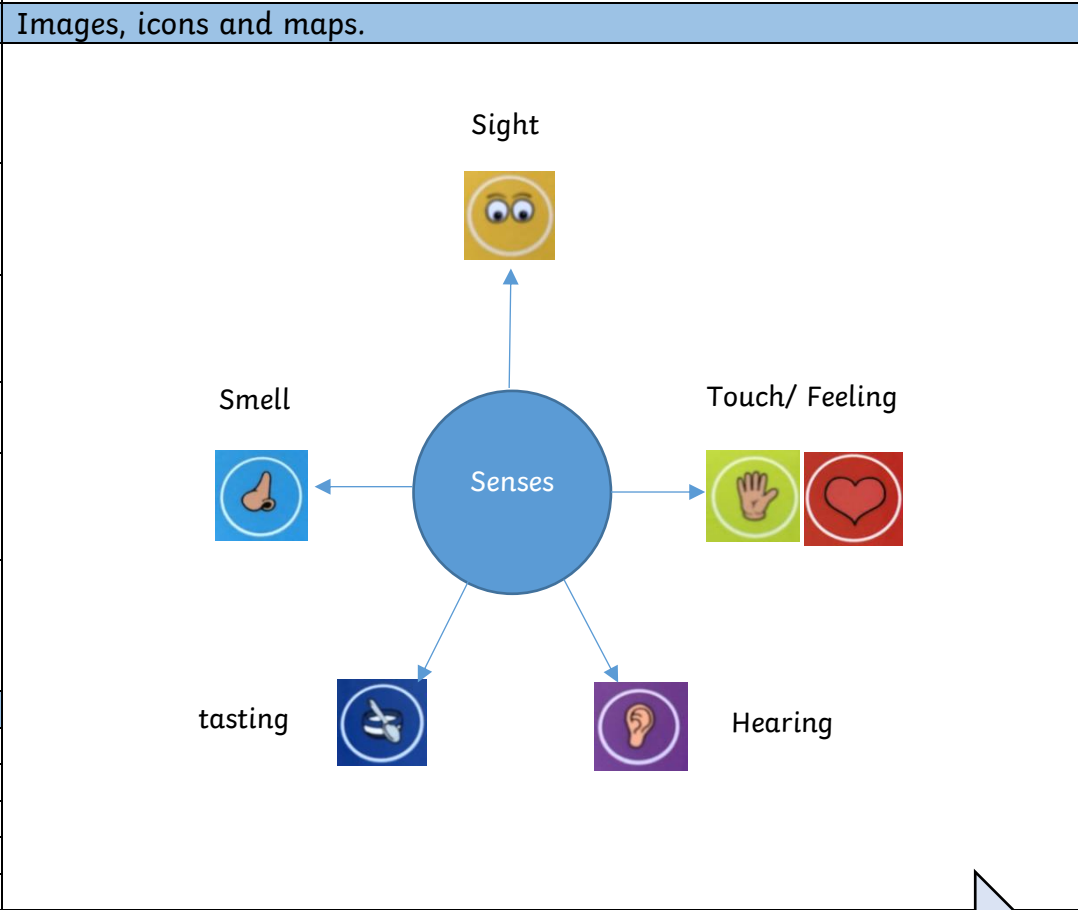
Concepts

Poem – A poem is a piece of writing in which the words are chosen for their beauty and sound and are carefully arranged, often in short lines which can rhyme.

Poet – A person who writes poems.

Key Vocabulary

Senses	There are five basic human senses : touch, sight, hearing, smell and taste
Verse	Verse is writing arranged in lines which have rhythm
Syllable	The beat of words. Breaking words down into smaller parts.
Imagery	Gives the reader help to form something in their minds.
Capital Letter	Each line must start with a capital letter.
Title	The name of the poem
