## Concepts

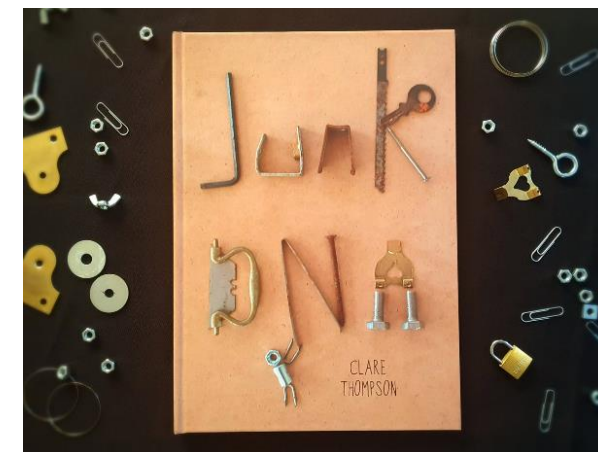
**Artist** – A person who creates art

**Art** – Something that you find beautiful, interesting or amazing. People might say “That painting is a work of art!”

## Key Vocabulary

## Images, icons and maps.

<b>shape</b>	Items which can be used to create art, such as paintbrushes, rolling pins, scissors, etc.
<b>objects</b>	A thing that can be seen or felt.
<b>pattern</b>	An arrangement of shapes, lines, letters, numbers, or colours that can be repeated or used again and again.
<b>loose parts</b>	Materials that can be moved and used in lots of ways.
<b>transient</b>	Only lasts a little while or always changing
<b>outline</b>	A line that shows the shape of an object.
<b>scene</b>	A picture of a place, event or activity.
<b>arrange</b>	To put in some kind of order, pattern or design.



## Key Facts

Art can be made on paper, by modelling or by a persons experiences.

Some people make art to tell other people about their thoughts or beliefs.

Objects can be arranged to represent objects or events.

We can represent what we see by looking at shapes and using objects to match them.

We can copy the style of an artist by using loose parts.
