

Art – Nature and 3D Sculpture

Prior Learning

Adds items to dough or clay to extend meaning. E.g. puts in bits of straw to be candles. Adds buttons for eyes.

Joins natural materials to represent things, e.g. to make stick man

Experiments with various tools and found things to create textures and patterns in clay and dough.

| sculpture | Art made in 3D form |
| pattern | A design where lines colours or shapes are repeated |
| texture | How something feels |

Key Facts

Art comes in many forms.

Some art is long lasting, some is only temporary.

Natural items can be used to create art.

Clay can be made more interesting by adding natural materials to it, or shaping it with tools.

Concepts

Artist – A person who creates art
